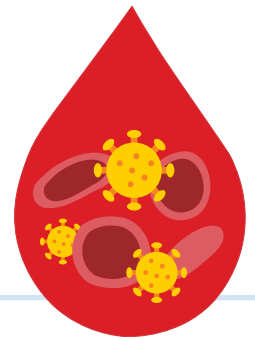


Blood or Bodily Fluid Exposure at School

! Your child was exposed to another person's blood or bodily fluid.

When a child contacts another person's blood or bodily fluid, we take preventive measures.

Blood or bodily fluid can contain germs that cause serious illness. We don't know if your child was exposed to such germs. But, in an abundance of caution, we react as though they were.



What did we do?

To keep your child safe, we followed our in-school first aid procedure.



If the exposure was through a cut to the skin, we washed the wound and surrounding skin with soap and water.



15 minutes

If the exposure was through a splash to the eyes, nose, or mouth, we flushed their eyes, nose, or mouth with water for 15 minutes.

Who do we report exposures to?

- School nurse or administrator.
- Parent/guardian.

To protect everyone's privacy, we do not share student or staff names or health info.

➔ **What should you do?**

Call your child's healthcare provider and report the exposure. Follow your healthcare provider's guidance.
