Naloxone (Narcan) is an easy-to-administer nasal spray. It helps reverse the effects of an opiate overdose.

Get a free naloxone kit.

An overdose is a medical emergency, but you can help! We'll provide a short training to teach you how to use naloxone to care for the person until emergency personnel arrives. And you can get a naloxone kit as often as you need one.
